Viv opens dance school

VIV GREENER is looking forward to an exciting new year after the recent opening of her new dance school, Stages School of Dance, at Tasker Hall in North Shields.

After teaching dance for over 15 years at the YMCA in Whitley Bay, Viv decided it was time to move to her own premises.

Having built up over 200 pupils, she needed the extra space, as interest in her classes continues to grow at a phenomenal rate.

Tasker Hall, a grade II listed building on Howard Street, North Shields, proved to be the perfect venue. After standing empty for the past five years, the hall which was a dance school until that time, had everything she was looking for to give her business a new start.

After spending months cleaning the interior and having repairs carried out on the building, the hall is now up and running and proving to be a fantastic venue for

pupils and teachers alike.

Having danced since the age of six herself, Viv caters for all age ranges and styles of dance, from 'Bizzie Bodies' classes for 18-months to three-year-olds, (mothers get involved too), to adult classes in modern, tap and ballet.

More recently, yoga, disco, jazz and cheerleading classes have grown in popularity, so the dance school really does cater for all. New classes, starting in 2003 also include lunchtime aerobics and drama classes.

Directly opposite the fantastic new Saville Exchange, the hall is perfectly located in a popular part of the town, ideal for people living in North Shields and surrounding areas.
